Education Update

We recently completed two CPIM classes. We had five of our members attend a CPIM Part 1 class that completed on April 5th. Those individuals are in the process of taking their exams and should be ready to start CPIM Part 2 soon. The second class was a CPIM Part 2 class that we did for NuVasive Corporation. That class had nine employees from NuVasive attending and completed on May 4th. NuVasive has completed two CPIM Part 1 and two CPIM Part 2 classes for their employees to-date and we are having initial discussions with them about a third round of CPIM training for employees in remote locations in North America and the Netherlands. We are having initial discussions with a company based out of Chicago about conducting a CSCP class for a dozen of their employees. We are also working with Crown Equipment in New Bremen on CPIM Part 1 and Part 2 classes that would be held in October and continue into early 2022. The activity level has increased for the on-site education front and it's exciting to see local companies investing in their employee's education and training!

<u>Dayton ASCM Chapter will be offering a full slate of CPIM, CSCP, and CLTD classes in September.</u> We are not conducting any classes this summer. Historically there hasn't been much demand during the summer. Most people seem to be able to find better things to do during the summer months than sitting in a class!

I continue to serve a three-year term as a Subject Matter Expert (SME) for the CPIM Part 2 course. In this role I work with a team that consists of other SME's, ASCM/APICS, and the Holmes Corporation, which is the course developer, on updates to the course materials. ASCM updates all certification courses on an annual basis as part of their continuous improvement efforts. For 2021 the CLTD and CSCP courses went through minor updates. The CPIM Part 1 and Part 2 courses went through major updates with lots of significant changes. The Team reviews questions and suggestions submitted from instructors and students globally. After the review process, we provide feedback on those submissions. This has been a great opportunity for me to network with other Chapters and to see the inner workings of how the courses are developed and updated on a regular basis.

He is a Certified Trainer for the CPIM, CSCP, and CLTD certification review courses and has over thirty years of experience delivering APICS classes. During his career he has held various positions including V.P. of Supply Chain Management, Director of Operations, Production Manager, Project Manager, Warehouse Manager, Production/inventory Control Manager, Production Supervisor, Distribution Analyst, Buyer and Production Planner.
