### **Dayton Progress - A Dayton Original, 75 Years in the Making**

David Turpin will present an overview of Dayton Progress and Dayton Lamina Corporation, the markets served and products produced. Dayton Progress has been serving the Auto and other industries from their headquarters in the Dayton area for the past 75 years as of 2021.

### **About the Speaker**

David Turpin is the President of Dayton Lamina Corporation (Dayton Progress) located in West Carrollton, OH. He has been with the company for 15 years and previously worked for Kennametal Inc. and Hitachi Computer Products of America. David earned his BA in Management Science from the University of Central Oklahoma and, while employed at Hitachi, earned his APICS Certification and his MBA from Oklahoma City University.

His APICS Story: David was a founding member of the UCO APICS Student Chapter. The year he graduated college, the opportunities for a new college graduate in Oklahoma were relatively few due to the economy at the time. Also the resources to find employment were much more limited then, than they are today. David mailed well over 100 resumes to companies with most of those resumes not addressing a specific known job opening. The UCO Student Chapter asked the Oklahoma City APICS Chapter if they would be willing to include the UCO graduating APICS Student Members in their Newsletters (through the USPS back then). Fortunately the OKC Chapter agreed and it was through that APICS Newsletter that David received his one and only interview before graduating, of all of the resumes he sent. Hitachi hired him.
