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Education Update

Jack Kerr - Director of Education

The Chapter offered CPIM, CSCP, and CLTD classes to our membership with classes scheduled to start in October, however we didn't have a lot of interest so we canceled them. There were a couple of people interested in CPIM Part 1 and we were able to get them into a class that Crown Equipment is sponsoring on site.

We recently wrapped up a CPIM Part 1 class for Dynapower, located in Vermont. We did that class utilizing Microsoft Teams. It was a small class for their Purchasing Department. Their four buyers and purchasing manager attended. We are in discussions with them for a CPIM Part 2 class but we haven't finalized a date yet.

NuVasive is holding a CPIM Part 2 class on Tuesdays. This is the third group of NuVasive employees that will have completed the CPIM program. There are nine employees from

NuVasive attending this class. Those employees are located in San Diego, Memphis, Dayton, New York, and North Carolina. We are utilizing Microsoft Teams to facilitate that class. Also attending is a member of the Dayton Chapter's Board of Directors. It's great that NuVasive is flexible and allows our members to attend their classes. It's also great that they are doing this training on an on-going basis for their employees. Based upon our conversations with them they are planning on putting a fourth group through the program.

Crown Equipment is holding a CPIM Part 1 class, with meetings on Fridays. There are fifteen Crown employees attending and we have two people that are based out of Houston attending. They work for a company that supplies equipment to the oil and gas exploration industry. It's interesting to hear them discuss how they handle their engineer-to-order business and attempt to apply APICS fundamentals in that environment. Crown is very generous for allowing outside people to attend their training programs. Jack Kerr has been doing both CPIM and CSCP classes for them since 2011. He has trained over 150 of their employees and has taught almost 50 different classes for them. Now that's a commitment to excellence!

Jack Kerr was recently contacted by the University of South Carolina about doing CSCP training for them. They found his name on the CSCP instructors list. They recently partnered with ASCM and are planning on offering the CSCP program through their continuing education program. Jack told them that he'd be interested in helping them out. They have contacted a number of instructors nationally so it remains to be seen whether they select Jack for their program.
